NOTES FROM CHIEF MUDD

As the weather turns colder and creates hazardous driving conditions on Kentucky roads, I offer the following tips for avoiding collisions which can result in property damage and possibly injury.

- Avoid unnecessary trips when the roads are covered in snow or ice.
- Make sure your windows are properly cleared of snow/ice - maximize visibility.
- Allow yourself plenty of time to get to your destination.
- Reduce speed on icy or snow covered roads.
- Increase your following distance and reaction time.
- Use your lights in all inclement weather. Use turn signals.
- Don't be distracted by your phone - keep eyes on the road.

I hope everyone has a wonderful and safe 2025. Happy New Year from the Bancroft Police Department.

HOW CAN WE CONTACT THE POLICE?

For immediate police assistance:

1. Emergency: **Dial 911**
2. Non-emergency police assistance: **Dial 311**

For non-urgent neighborhood concerns:

1. Call our police line at **(502) 263-3663**. Leave a voicemail with your name and phone number. Chief Mudd will call you back when he is on duty.

For your safety, please call 911 or 311 to have police dispatched. If Chief Mudd is working, then they will dispatch him to help you, otherwise, they will dispatch a Metro police officer. Do not personally seek out Chief Mudd to get assistance for an emergency.
